Chinook Winds Lodge Welcomes Residents Home on Sept. 26, 2017 Flood Mitigation & Recovery from Mid-June Flood Now Complete

On Sept. 26, residents return home to Chinook Winds Lodge in Carstairs Alberta. A plumbing incident in mid-June resulted in extensive flood damage to the basement of the lodge. Residents were immediately evacuated and remediation and clean-up efforts began.

During the clean-up efforts, facilities management and key site staff kept in constant contact with all parties to keep them all apprised of progress and to coordinate work efforts. As a result, recovery efforts will be complete for residents to move back to their Chinook Winds Lodge home.

Chief Administrative Officer of Mountain View Seniors' Housing Sam Smalldon said, "We look forward to welcoming our seniors back home. We wanted to ensure there was a safe and stable home environment before they returned to their suites. We would like to thank all those who helped to make this recovery a success, specifically the residents themselves and their families, Alberta Government, the MVSH Board, the MVSH project management team, the MVSH staff, the Town of Carstairs, our insurance company, and all our vendors. This was indeed a community effort."
